Enoch Walked With God

Genesis 5: 1-32

This is the book of the generations of Adam. In the day when God created man, He made him in the likeness of God. ²He created them male and female, and He blessed them and named them Man in the day when they were created. ³When Adam had lived one hundred and thirty years, he became the father of a son in his own likeness, according to his image, and named him Seth. ⁴Then the days of Adam after he became the father of Seth were eight hundred years, and he had other sons and daughters. ⁵So all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years, and he died. ⁶Seth lived one hundred and five years, and became the father of Enosh. ⁷Then Seth lived eight hundred and seven years after he became the father of Enosh, and he had other sons and daughters. ⁸So all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years, and he died. ⁹Enosh lived ninety years, and became the father of Kenan. ¹⁰Then Enosh lived eight hundred and fifteen years after he became the father of Kenan, and he had other sons and daughters. ¹¹So all the days of Enosh were nine hundred and five years, and he died. ¹²Kenan lived seventy years, and became the father of Mahalalel. ¹³Then Kenan lived eight hundred and forty years after he became the father of Mahalalel, and he had other sons and daughters. ¹⁴So all the days of Kenan were nine hundred and ten years, and he died. ¹⁵Mahalalel lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Jared. ¹⁶Then Mahalalel lived eight hundred and thirty years after he became the father of Jared, and he had other sons and daughters. ¹⁷So all the days of Mahalalel were eight hundred and ninety-five years, and he died. ¹⁸Jared lived one hundred and sixty-two years, and became the father of Enoch. ¹⁹Then Jared lived eight hundred years after he became the father of Enoch, and he had other sons and daughters. ²⁰So all the days of Jared were nine hundred and sixty-two years, and he died. ²¹Enoch lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Methuselah. ²²Then Enoch walked with God three hundred years after he became the father of Methuselah, and he had other sons and daughters. ²³So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. ²⁴Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him. ²⁵Methuselah lived one hundred and eighty-seven years, and became the father of Lamech. ²⁶Then Methuselah lived seven hundred and eighty-two years after he became the father of Lamech, and he had other sons and daughters. ²⁷So all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred and sixty-nine years, and he died. ²⁸Lamech lived one hundred and eighty-two years, and became the father of a son. ²⁹Now he called his name Noah, saying, "This one will give us rest from our work and from the toil of our hands arising from the ground which the LORD has cursed." ³⁰Then Lamech lived five hundred and ninety-five years after he became the father of Noah, and he had other sons and daughters. ³¹So all the days of Lamech were seven hundred and seventy-seven years, and he died. ³²Noah was five hundred years old, and Noah became the father of Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

Discussion Questions

Genesis 5: 1-32

1. What is so important about genealogy to God? Please read the following scriptures to answer: Genesis 11:1-26; 1 Chronicles 1:1-3; Matthew 1:1-17; Luke 3:34-38; Jude 14. What meaning does genealogy serve for God's purposes?
2. What was the curse of all these men/patriarch's dying? Hint, go back and read Genesis 3:15 again to find the answer. How many times in our scriptures today did it say: "and they died?"
3. Who was Enoch and why is he so important? Read Genesis 5:22-24 and Hebrews 11:5. What was different about Enoch or what was he spared from by God?
4. What does the term: "walked or walking with God" mean? Read Genesis 5: 22-24 with regard to Enoch. Do we read this theme of "walked with God" anywhere else in the Bible? Hint, read: Genesis 6:9; Genesis 17:1-2; Deuteronomy 30:15-16.
5. Are you currently "walking with God?" If so, what does your daily life with Jesus look like? If not, why aren't you seeking Jesus who is the giver of life? Pray to ask God to reveal His Son Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. The Key lesson from today's teaching is: Life comes through "walking with God." Enoch pleased God by "walking with Him" and so can you.
