

Discussion Questions

Genesis 6: 1-12

1. Genesis 6: 1-7 shows a very sad time on the earth. Verse 5 says of man, “*every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.*” What was God’s response to this pervasive evil on the earth? Verses 6 and 7 will show us. How do you compare moral conditions on the earth then with conditions on the earth today? Use specific examples. How would you respond to someone who said that God would never judge people today so fiercely? Check out II Peter 2: 4-11.

2. In verse 8 it says, “*But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD.*” What does it take to find God’s favor when those around you are not at all interested in pleasing God? What does the Scripture say about Noah in Hebrews 11:7 and I Peter 2:11-12?

3. Verse 9 says plainly that “*Noah walked with God*” (the same description given to Enoch in chapter 5, verse 24). How does one walk with God while those around us don’t? Check out Galatians 5: 16-23.

4. Three high school seniors at your church are talking with you about graduation and going off to do different things: one to a job in a large company, one to college, and one to the military. All will be living away from home. What would be your advice for “walking with God” while many around them are not? Base your answers on Scripture.

Discussion Questions
