Genesis 6: 1-12

1. In verse 13 God says (in response to the human violence on the earth), ***"I am about to destroy them with the earth."*** How would you answer a person who said that a God of love would never do such a thing? Please cite Scripture references to defend your answer. You could check out II Peter 2:5-9 and Revelation 20:11-15

2. But there was also good news! God provided an ark (verse 14) to preserve Noah and his family through the flood. In verse 18 God says to Noah, ***"But I will establish My covenant with you."*** Explain the word "covenant." What does it mean? What is God promising to do, based on this covenant, in verses 18-21? Has God made covenants with us today? Check out I Corinthians 11:25; Hebrews 1:1-14; Hebrews 9:11-15; and Hebrews 12:24.

3. Take note of Noah's response to the job God gave him, building the ark: verse 22 ***"Thus Noah did; according to all that God had commanded him, so he did."*** This verse speaks of Noah's actions and Hebrews 11:7 speaks of Noah's faith. In this picture of Noah, how are faith and works both evident? How are they to be evident in our lives?
