Discussion Questions
Genesis 3: 8-15

1. In **verses 8-10** we see that once sin entered the human race it disrupted fellowship between God and humankind and between humans themselves. **How have you seen this same disruption of fellowship due to sin in your life? In lives of others around you? How would you answer a person who claims that sin is not real, only a concept believed by some? Use Scripture: Isaiah 64:6; Romans 3:23, and Romans 6:23 will get you started. What other evidence could you offer, alongside Scripture, that humans have a sin problem that separates them from God?**
2. God promised a Savior in a rather muted, but real way ... through the figure of the crushed head of the snake (Satan) and the crushed heel of the seed of the woman (a human being--specifically, Jesus), **verse 15**. **Why would God offer such a rich and costly remedy for our sinful rebellion --the death of His own sinless Son? What motivated God the Father to do this? See John 3:16 and Romans 5:8.**
3. **How would you answer someone who said that believing this is fine for Christians, but that it does not apply to other people, after all they have their own religion, or lack thereof? In other words, how do we know that Jesus' life, death, and resurrection is our only hope of salvation? See John 3:14-18; 11 Corinthians 5:21; Galatians 4:4-5; and 1 Timothy 2:5-6.**
